
Tucson stock - first specimens



More great Broken Hill specimens

Although we have enjoyed ourselves enormously shopping in Tucson (after all, Susan was born to shop), we will also continue to concentrate on Australian mineral specimens, especially from classic localities such as Broken Hill.

We've been very fortunate in being able to access a number of sources of Broken Hill minerals. Most of those featured below are from the Zinc Corporation Mine and consist mainly of Bustamite/galena/calcite specimens and spessartine/galena specimens, although there are also a couple of very nice rhodonites and an attractive gemmy smithsonite.





